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I should understand why people in the past acted as they did.

I should be able to place a few events and objects in time order

I should know where some people and events fit into a chronological framework

I should know about some of the lives of significant individuals in the past and how they compare to aspects of life in different periods I should be able to use stories and other sources to show that I know and understand key features of events.

I will be taught facts on...

- The toys we play with today
- The toys I played with when I was a baby
- The toys my guardian/parents played with
- The toys my older relatives played with
- To know that there are similarities and differences between toys we play with now and toys that were played with in the past.
- That many toys today are made from different materials than in the past.
- That the changes in toys that grandparents, parents and we have can be explored by looking at artefacts.
- That the changes in toys over time can be placed on a timeline.

- What toys do we play with today?
- What toys did I play with when I was a baby?
- What toys did my guardian/ parent play with?
- How are their toys similar or different from my toys?
- What does the word modern mean?
- How can I find out about the past?
- What were toys like 30 years ago?
- What were toys like 60 years ago?
- What were toys from the past made from?
