 To comment and ask questions about aspects of their familiar world, such as the place where they live or the natural world To talk about some of the things they have observed such as plants, animals, natural and found objects To develop an understanding of growth, decay and changes over time To know about similarities and differences in relation to places, objects, materials and living things To talk about the features of their own immediate environment and how environments might vary from one another. 		 Use vocabulary such as bigger/smaller, near/far Use large scale maps and aerial photos of the school and local area Recognise simple features on maps e.g. buildings, roads and fields Follow a route on a map starting with a picture map of the school Draw a simple map e.g. of a garden, route map, place in a story Use and construct basic symbols in a map key Use simple fieldwork techniques such as observation and identification to study the geography of the school and its grounds Use locational and directional language to describe feature and routes e.g. left/right, forwards and backwards. 	 What is our school building like? What type of building and size is the school? (e.g. old, new, one/two storeys, few/many classrooms etc.) What geographical features are there in the school grounds? (e.g. man-made and natural.) How could we improve our school grounds or local environment? Where is our school located? What sort of area is it in? (e.g. busy, quiet, rural, built-up etc.) Who lives in this area? Who works in this area? Where do they work and what jobs might they do? What geographical features can we see within a short walking distance from our school? What features can we see in the distance?
